



Spring is in the Air...somewhere!

Spring, and Easter both signal new life. For sure change is in your future. If you take a moment to look through the CAT survey results you'll see where Pilgrim needs change and growth on the road to renewed vitality. The energy, spiritual



vitality, giving, and membership vitality are all low compared to most congregations in the ELCA...even those with older folks. Your leadership will be working, thinking, and praying about reversing these trends. Take baby steps but move fast!

What I have been trying to do is generate some excitement and flexibility in worship. Pilgrim does tolerate change fairly well and I'm grateful to those of you who have been willing to try new styles of worship for the sake of attracting younger people and newer people. I am confident that Lorelei will continue to provide skilled leadership and connections to students for these efforts. As one visiting family remarked "When we've looked at on line worship Pilgrim is the only one that young people are visible in. That's really why we are here."

The small steps you can all make is to begin to intentionally not only welcome but get involved with new people and with each other. Pilgrim isn't very connected at this time. It was before Covid. There were groups who gathered to help with mission trips, meals for UWS students, Confirmation, and the community school outreach. Covid put an end to all of that. Healthy churches build relationships so that people stay because they have friends, not just because the church is friendly. Friendships build through contact, communication and a willingness to share life and work together. It's easy to come to worship and go home with only one or two "hello's". If you find that you can worship on line without missing the people, it's a good indication that more relationship ties need to be built. Most people come to church to worship and make friends. Worship alone isn't enough. Worship alone will leave you watching worship like a consumer, rather than being a participating member of the Body of Christ.

Spend a little more time in the coffee hour. Seek out people to talk to. Be willing to help with activities that the leadership suggests. Expect that the Christian life means learning and growing and serving at every stage in life. You don't need to just get busy....business doesn't change churches. People genuinely caring for people, actively connecting with people, and eager to serve people...those are the marks of a vital church.

My prayers for you as I leave you are that God will send the Spirit of Pentecost and stir revival, renewal, and hope at Pilgrim. It has been my privilege to serve you these past months and I pray God's most genuine blessings on you in these times of transition.



Key Indicators about Pilgrim Lutheran from the data:

- Overall satisfaction and energy are low.
- Members' evaluation of the church's ministry is strongly determined by how they evaluate the pastor. It is the lens through which they view the entire church. Pilgrim is a highly clergy-focused congregation.
- The degree to which members believe Pilgrim is willing to adjust in the ways it goes about its ministry is above average. This is a positive reading and an asset for moving forward.
- Increasing the perception and sense among all that there is genuine care and concern among members in time of personal need is an area needing attention. This is the responsibility of all members, not only the clergyperson.

Regarding the Pastoral Transition

During this transition your members indicate:

- They are very comfortable with the timing of the pastoral transition and are ready to move forward.
- Their general involvement in Pilgrim's ministries and their availability to help during the pastoral transition will be about the same.
- They desire to see a change in the skills and responsibilities of the next pastor.
- They are more or less comfortable with the current direction of the church. This is a good time to identify areas that should be maintained and areas where changes are needed.

- 2. Develop a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them.


Unusually High Priorities For All Members of Pilgrim


Book donated to the little library: The Book "Hunting Magic Eels" has been donated to the little library for others to enjoy. It's a great read that we discussed during Lent.

Pilgrim Lutheran Church March 14, 2023 Council Special Meeting Minutes

- I. Call to Order and Opening Prayer: Meeting called to order at 6:40 by President Mary Johnson-Garay. Pastor Carolyn lead in opening prayer.
- II. Those in attendance: Pastor Carolyn Mowchan, Pastor Joel Huenemann, Mary Johnson-Garay, Colleen Elonen, Courtney Dietsche, Dale Johnson, Don Miller, Dan Breneman, Tad Matheson, Pastor Randy Olson.

Excused: Tyler Austreng, Jamie Peterson

- The call committee has met a few times. The survey is available for the congregation to fill out. More responses are needed to get a good perspective on the members' opinions.
- The Ministry Site Profile will be posted by the end of May so that interviews can begin.
- Pastor Randy will come back to Pilgrim on May 21 after the MSP is completed but before it is submitted to answer questions and provide any assistance needed.
- Pastor Carolyn will complete her interim position on June 1, 2023. The synod will assign a bridge pastor until one is hired. Pastor Joel may serve as the bridge pastor. Pastor Carolyn will preach on June 4 as her last day.
- Pastor Joel will be paid for his office hours as part of his pastoral duties.

Meeting adjourned at 7:52, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Pilgrim Lutheran Church March 28, 2023 Council Minutes

- **I. Call to Order and Opening Prayer:** Meeting called to order at 6:32 by President Mary Johnson-Garay. Pastor Joel lead in opening prayer.
- II. Those in attendance: Pastor Joel Huenemann, Mary Johnson-Garay, Colleen Elonen, Courtney Dietsche, Dale Johnson, Don Miller, Jamie Peterson, Dan Breneman.

Excused: Pastor Carolyn Mowchan, Tad Matheson

III. Approve Minutes: Dan made a motion to approve the January council meeting minutes. Dale seconded. Motion passed.

IV. Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Joel commended the Altar Guild for their many hours of hard work polishing the brass.
- Pastor Joel asked if we want to continue with the Celtic and contemporary services during the summer. The council will ask Loralei if she would like to do that. He said he feels comfortable doing the service if she will plan the music. The council will also confirm the number of services she will do to remain within our budget.
- Pastor Carolyn's last day as Interim Pastor will be June 4, 2023.

- Don will put together a Live Control team that will go to United Presbyterian Church to be trained on their equipment.
- Beginning in June, the worship style (traditional, contemporary, Celtic) of the next week's service will be added to the bulletin.
- The council decided to split the Lenten collection money evenly between Faith United and Ruth House to support local food shelf initiatives. Colleen made a motion to do so, and Mary seconded. Motion passed.

V. Call Committee:

• The committee is working on filling in the parts of the MSP form with data that was not part of the congregational survey.

VI. Ministry:

• Hospitality reminders will be added to the Progress so those who are scheduled are able to make other arrangements, if necessary.

VII. Property:

- The flag has been replaced.
- There is a new vacuum at church. Possible donation?
- Our security cameras are old and don't provide the best picture. The cost to replace all of them is \$800. After some discussion, this item will be put on a future agenda.

VIII. Finance:

• The February and March financials were reviewed and discussed. Mary made a motion to accept the financial report, Dale seconded. Motion passed.

IX. New Business:

- Dale will check with a local printer in Superior to determine how much printing the offering envelopes would cost versus using our current printing company.
- Mary will work on providing rolls and snacks for Easter morning service.
- The times for the Good Friday and Easter services will be added to the digital sign.

Meeting adjourned at 8:04, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The funeral Service for Dale Johnson will be held Saturday morning, May 13th. Visitation starting at 9 a.m. with the funeral to start at 10 a.m.




