

# Pastor's Page



### Pilgrim Lutheran Church July 25, 2023 Council Minutes

- **I. Call to Order and Opening Prayer:** Meeting called to order at 6:35 by President Mary Johnson-Garay. Joel led us in opening prayer.
- II. Those in attendance: Mary Johnson-Garay, Colleen Elonen, Courtney Dietsche, Don Miller, Dan Breneman, Joel Huenemann, Jamie Peterson, Tad Matheson. Excused: Ted Nelson.
- III. Approve Minutes: Dan made a motion to approve the June 27 council meeting minutes. Don seconded. Motion passed.

### IV. Pastor's Report:

- Twin Ports Outreach will conduct a church service in Pilgrim's parking lot on a weekday during September and October. The dates have yet to be determined.
- The Red Cross would like to host a blood drive at the church. We will talk to them
  to see what dates would be feasible.
- For Jacketfest, Pilgrim will have a homecoming picnic and possibly a hymn sing.
- Don will contact Jim to learn about recording our services starting again in the fall.
- For worship services, we will use Setting 8 for most services for the sake of consistency.
- We have two events planned with UW-Superior's World Student Association.
  Pilgrim will cook breakfast for new international students on Friday, September 1,
  at 7:00 am. Colleen will ask for donations from Super One, Upper Lakes Foods,
  and Superior Small Batch. The Association will do their annual cooking
  demonstration at church on Saturday, November 18. More details will be
  forthcoming.
- Communion at the rail was well received, so we will begin having it at the traditional services

#### V. Music/Ministry:

- The council will need to finalize Lorelei's contract and responsibilities. Colleen made a motion to extend Lorelei's contract for one year at the new pay rate in the contract. Tad seconded. Motion passed.
- · David Tryggestad will continue as organist for another year.

#### VI. Property:

- The freezer in the kitchen has stopped working, but we may not need to purchase a new one.
- The dishwasher is not using enough sanitizer as it runs cycles, so it will need to be manually adjusted.
- Parts of the roof will need to be re-tarred to stop water leaks.
- Once all fire extinguisher locations have been determined, we will create a map for reference.

#### Council minutes continued:

- Due to the faucet leaking in the pastor's office, we will replace both the sink and faucet.
- Mary suggested the council consider removing some pews in order to increase handicap accessibility. If the pews are removed from the sanctuary, they would be stored somewhere, not removed from the church.
- It was suggested that the council have someone from the Superior Police
  Department come to the August meeting to discuss safety whenever the church is
  open to the public.

#### VII. Finance:

 The council is considering changing from using Mattson Accounting to using Quick Books. Someone will ask Tyler Austreng if he is able to assist with training Don or other staff to use the software.

#### VIII. Old Business:

- Although we are currently offering rides to church for those who need them, some congregants may not be aware that this service has started again after COVID. The information will be in the Progress and the bulletin.
- Joel suggested looking into the possibility of offering a weeknight chess club for kids.

Meeting adjourned at 8:02, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

# **Purpose**

# The Secret Weapon to Good Health

Over the past several months, I have had a variety of opportunities to compare how life can offer different outcomes. I have bumped into individuals who seem to have given up on life, have no hope, and struggle to get life moving in a positive direction, these individuals are very self-involved. In direct contrast I have had the pleasure of observing and visiting with individuals who are so full of life that their energy field is contagious. When I pulled harder on that thread of life and energy, the results disclosed that every one of these people had a sense of purpose! Their purpose might be volunteering at the library, helping the homeless, working at the food shelf, being involved in one of the local community groups or taking care of children. It didn't matter what it was, but what was clear is they were a part of something bigger than themselves. They were serving their community and it energized them.

I was curious, is having a sense of purpose good for your health? After some research it became very clear that the answer is yes! According to greatergood.berkley.edu

Purpose fuels hope and optimism, and purposeful people tend to have better health and longevity. Older adults who report to have more purpose in life, experience less functional decline (like weakened grip strength), less cognitive and memory impairment, and lower risk of alzheimer's disease.

People with a sense of purpose also take better care of themselves. They make healthier lifestyle choices, nutritional choices, and engage in more preventative behaviors like medical screenings and preventative care.

Our mental health also benefits from having a sense of purpose. We are connected to others, participate in building relationships, laugh and find joy in working together; along with feeling a sense of satisfaction knowing you are making the world a better place.

Research is also beginning to reveal that having a sense of purpose can bring about a better night of sleep. A good night of sleep provides enhanced brain performance, mood and health. When we lack sleep for long stretches we begin to affect the well being of our entire body. Lack of sleep raises the risk of many diseases including heart disease, obesity, stroke and dementia.

What is your purpose? Are you seeking a purpose for your life? Pilgrim would love for you to join us as we begin rebuilding our committees to serve our local community. There are many opportunities for you to find a purpose at church.




# **Blood Drive**
