

Saints and Siblings in Christ,

One of the most frequent questions I get asked as a pastor is, "what does the church do?" And that's a fair question – especially in a time when our society is becoming less and less churched, with fewer people willing to commit the time and energy to joining or maintaining a relationship with a congregation. Now, that's a hard reality for us churchy folks, and some might even look at these smaller numbers and less involvement as a failure. I disagree.

Instead, I think this is our greatest opportunity. There is an assumption by many in our communities that the church exists for itself. It is, for lack of a better understanding, a club full of folks who put a lot of time and effort into upkeep of a facility. Friends, it is our responsibility and call to change that notion.

I know, people of God, that the church exists to share the good news of Jesus Christ. I also know that "my talk talks and my walk talks but my walk talks louder than my talk talks." That is, what we say matters. But what we do matters more. Our proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ exists hand in hand with service to our neighbor.

The season of Lent is a perfect time to reflect on and renew our commitment to that service. Ash Wednesday falls, appropriately enough, on Valentine's Day. We begin this season in love and continue it in service. This year our theme for Lent is "Created for Community" as we renew our commitment to service in this place we call home. I hope that you will join us for worship and supper every Wednesday in Lent at 6:00. In addition to our prayers, songs, and conversations, we will hear about the work being done here at Pilgrim, and by some of our ministry partners around Superior. We will also have the opportunity to gather items to support these groups, as we practice walking the walk of faith together.

Please take time to read through our list of needs and get to know some of these partner organizations throughout the Lenten season. May we all be moved to continue to boldly live out our lives of faith together.



Pilgrim Lutheran Church December 19, 2023 Council Minutes

- **I. Call to Order and Opening Prayer:** Meeting called to order at 6:36 by President Mary Johnson-Garay. Pr. Tanner led us in opening prayer.
- **II. Those in attendance:** Mary Johnson-Garay, Colleen Elonen, Tad Matheson, Courtney Dietsche, Don Miller, Dan Breneman, Jamie Peterson, Pastor Tanner Howard. Excused: Ted Nelson.
- **III. Approve Minutes:** Tad made a motion to approve the November 28 council meeting minutes. Don seconded. Motion approved.
- IV. Meeting with Shane: The council met with Shane regarding his lease of the kitchen and other space in the Fellowship Hall and his plans for 2024. He is looking for another location for his business, and he asked if Pilgrim could extend his contract either on a month-by-month basis or by three months, if needed. He also offered to help us find a new tenant for the space. Regarding the cleaning of the kitchen, he agreed to restore it to cleanliness at the end of each day, and we agreed that anyone using it on the weekend would restore it to the condition in which they found it on Friday. Shane's items in the Fireside Room will be moved to another room.

V. Pastor's Report:

- The Lutheran churches in Superior are creating a list of available resources for people in need so there is more awareness of where to refer people when they need help.
- Facebook and the website are still being worked on.
- Sunday School and confirmation will be started up again in 2024.
- Bible Study will be on Thursdays at 10:00 am.
- Theology on Tap will happen on Wednesday nights at 7:00 at the Tap on Tower (1106 Tower Ave.).
- Pr. Tanner asked if Pilgrim has had a pastor's discretionary fund in the past. We haven't had one by that name specifically, but there are funds that could be used for that purpose.
- Pr. Tanner would like to convert the unused right choir transept into a Prayground for use during worship by families with small children. He has someone who is able to help with the construction and moving the items in that area. Dan made a motion to convert the space, and Tad seconded. The motion was approved.

VI. Music/Ministry:

- The Vesper Tea was very successful, with around 180 people in attendance. The event raised \$660, which will be turned over to the PLCP group to donate to a local charity.
- Livestream of worship service will begin on Christmas Eve.
- To create better space for those with mobility challenges, four pews will be removed and stored in another part of the church. We are still working on making the hearing assistance devices functional.
- The various mission work ideas are still be worked on.
- We would like to highlight one community partner each week of Lent. Pr. Tanner will work on finding out which organizations need money or supplies, and members could donate that week.

VII. Property:

- Tad has one roof estimate so far and will get more. He is also getting estimates for the bell tower and the area around the chimney that needs work.
- The City of Superior will decide in January about the grant money for structural improvements. The council will have the application information ready in case the grant will be offered. We will also check on getting conservation information from SWLP.

VIII. Finance:

- The 2024 budget is set based on projected giving and expenses.
- The Annual Report will be presented at the annual meeting after worship on January 28.
- Colleen made a motion to approve the financial report. Mary seconded. Motion approved.

IX. New Business:

- During Lent, Fred Dudderar will be taking pictures for our new directory. More information on dates and times will be forthcoming.
- The next blood drive will be March 19, 2024.
- In order to better accommodate schedules, Mary proposed changing the day of council meetings to the second Tuesday of the month. Dan made the motion to change the day, and Mary seconded. Motion approved.
- Clarification was provided regarding when each council member's term will conclude.
- There will be a joint ELCA service on February 25 at 10:00 at Concordia Lutheran Church.
- The annual meeting will be at 10:30 on January 28. Annual reports are due to Judy by January 10.
- Pilgrim received a thank-you note from Anna Hansen.

Meeting adjourned at 8:35, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

IV. Pastor's Report:

- Lent starts on February 1, and Pr. Tanner would like to do some soup suppers and worship services on Wednesday nights. Loralei has met with him to discuss music during Lent.
- An idea for Mariners' Sunday (the first Sunday in March) is having a speaker and appetizers after the service. Pr. Tanner will look into this.
- Some names were suggested as possible additions to the council. Colleen will ask those she knows and go from there.
- Pr. Tanner would like to form an audit committee to audit Pilgrim's financial statements once a year.
- For our joint service with Concordia on February 25, we will provide the coffee and another beverage.
- Mary volunteered to help out with Sunday School.
- Pr. Tanner will create a sign-up for people to be greeters.

V. Music/Ministry:

- Livestream is going well. Pr. Tanner will let members who are in other locations for the winter know that we have Livestream operational again.
- Current mission work ideas are continuing to progress.

VI. Property:

• The carpenters will be here on February 8 & 9 as well as the following week to complete construction of the Prayground in the right-hand transept.

- SWLP was in the building to advise on light replacement to increase utility efficiency. They have a program that will match the money we spend on upgrades and repairs dollar for dollar. Some areas covered by this program include thermostats, lights, and air conditioners.
- We are still waiting for the City of Superior to decide on the grant money.

VII. Finance:

- The 2024 budget is set and ready for discussion and approval at the annual meeting.
- Mary made a motion to approve the financial report. Tad seconded. Motion approved.


VIII. Old Business:
