What a joy December was! Gathering for Advent worship, blessing our community with the Bethlehem Garage Sale, celebrating with Lessons and Carols and Vesper Tea, and worshipping together on Christmas Eve. We collected hats and mittens for our neighbors, hosted college students for meals, learned to make lefse, offered gluten free cooking classes, held another blood drive, and blasted through our \$5,000 goal for the Walk the Talk Campaign. Friends, the Spirit is alive in this place, and I am grateful for each and every one of you who contribute your time, your talents, and your gifts for God mission and ministry here at Pilgrim.

As we move into this new year (2025 – can you believe it!), we continue to keep our eyes wide and hearts open for the people and places God is calling us to serve. We will continue to collect coats, hats, and gloves throughout these winter months to distribute to our community – look for the drop-off space in the narthex. Our Sunday School and Confirmation programs are going strong, and we are always excited to welcome new students and teachers to these classes. Our Traveling Tutors continue to read with students at Northern Lights Elementary. And we're always looking for new ideas to help us best serve our community.

January also brings with it some administrative responsibilities as a congregation. We will gather for our annual meeting on Sunday, January 26th immediately following worship. There we will thank outgoing council members and elect new ones. We will hear reports from our leadership and committees, and we will pass a budget for 2025. For those of you interested (and I hope you all are), we will hold a budget forum on Sunday, January 19th following worship. There you can take a look at the proposed budget from the council and ask questions prior to the annual meeting on the 26th.

Finally, a plug for the good work that our newly assembled Stewardship Team has been doing. First of all, a huge thank you to Colleen Elonen, Dan Breneman, and Paul Goesling for their work on the Walk the Talk Campaign this fall. This idea came from the group as a way to help fund non-budgeted new and innovative ministry opportunities with a \$5,000 goal. Friends, we have exceeded that goal! As of printing we have raised \$5,070 for the Walk the Talk campaign and I am grateful for your generous contributions to this cause.

Moving forward, the team is excited to announce that we are taking part in a new program called Generous Together. Generous Together is a year-round stewardship experience intended for congregations to use to help us name, claim, and give language to the generosity already present in our congregation. On Sunday, January 5th we will welcome the Rev. Taryn Montgomery, Synod Minister for Discipleship and Christion Community in the Northeastern Synod of Minnesota, to preach and lead us in the first session of this initiative. Please plan to join us for worship that Sunday, and stick around to hear more about the program.

As I said at the beginning – the Spirit is moving here at Pilgrim, and I am excited for our work together. Thank you for being part of it.

In October your Stewardship Team placed a challenge before the congregation: raise \$5,000 by the end of the year through the *Walk the Talk Campaign* – an initiative to provide funding for new and expanded ministry opportunities here at Pilgrim. We are pleased to report that we have



surpassed that goal and raised \$5,070.00 that is already being used for ministry. As Pastor Tanner says: thank you, thank you!

Looking ahead we are excited to announce that Pilgrim is partnering with our neighbors in the Northeastern Minnesota Synod in the *Generous Together* stewardship initiative. Generous Together will help us to better identify and celebrate the generosity already alive in our congregation, while also giving us the opportunity to explore the different aspects of stewardship and generosity in our church and community. This initiative is for everyone – all ages and levels of experience in the church – and will be filled with opportunities for conversation, reflection, and connections through our stories and the stories of scripture.

Our first session will be led by the Rev. Taryn Mongomery from the NE Minnesota Synod office on Sunday, January 5th. Having fun with the first graders. Practicing sight words and then watching their faces when they sound out words they aren't familiar with is awesome. ~ Laura Swanson


Things are really going well and I am truly enjoy being in the kindergartenclassroom with the kids!


Offering Envelopes for 2025
