

Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Saints and Siblings in Christ,



Last week I had the opportunity to head back to my alma mater, Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa, for a ReFormation and Renewal event. I was able to gather with old classmates and hear a variety of professors who presented on everything from systematic theology to baptismal ecclesiology, to a deep dive on our church rituals in a modern context. We also honored the retirement of one of my professors, the Rev. Dr. Winston Persaud.

You've probably heard me mention Winston before. He famously describes the concept of our lived righteousness with the example of the 'righteous mango tree'. In short, a mango tree that produces pears is an all around interesting tree – but it's not righteous. Because it is not doing what God created it to do or being what God created it to be. A righteous mango tree produces mangos. In the same way, our righteousness is grounded in being who God created us to be and doing what God created us to do. Wherein the greatest commandments come into play: to love God and to love our neighbors.

I've been pondering this concept of righteousness a lot recently — as those of you who attend Theology on Tap can, no doubt, attest to. As people of faith, followers of Christ, faith-filled people — what is God calling us to right now? Who are we being called to be? What are we being called to do? There is, to say the least, a lot going on in the world around us. So much so that by the time this goes to print and gets to you, I really have no idea what Other Things may have happened. All these things come at us quickly and can seem overwhelming. Indeed, it's supposed to feel overwhelming — that's part of it. And while I don't have an easy answer on exactly what we should do next, what is clear to me is that we're being called to something. To resist. To welcome. To care for. To love. To be this imperfect people, called to a community of faith that is Pilgrim Lutheran Church, in order that we might better be who God created us to be. Which must involve caring for the people around us — especially those who are in the most danger right now.

On April 9th we commemorated the 80th anniversary of the martyrdom of Dietrich Bonhoeffer – pastor, professor, reformer – who was murdered by the Nazi regime at Flossenbürg concentration camp in 1945. Among his many words still relevant today include these, which, I think, reflect my professor's definition of a Christian's righteousness well: "Not to speak, is to speak. Not to act, is to act."

Friends, Christ is indeed risen – and that changes things. It should change us. It must change us. Something I hope we can ponder – and do – together.





From the Bishop...

This article appeared in the Wisconsin Examiner on March 27, 2025. It is written by the bishops of the ELCA synods of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

As Lutheran bishops we stand for religious liberty and against Christian Nationalism

Who gets to decide what is Christian? What does religious liberty look like today? With so much unsettling and destabilizing news coming from the new administration in Washington, DC, it's hard to keep up with and keep track of everything. We believe, however, that a recent decision by the President is a dangerous threat to religious liberty, promotes Christian Nationalism, and all people who care about our democracy need to take note.

We, the Lutheran (ELCA) bishops in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, are concerned about an executive order signed by President Trump on Feb. 6 that established a new "Task Force to Eradicate Anti-Christian Bias." This task force has the duty to "identify any unlawful anti-Christian policies, practices, or conduct by an agency." While some might think that all Christians would support an effort to root out "anti-Christian bias," that's not the case. We believe this executive order is a threat to the religious pluralism enshrined in the Constitution and does not actually protect Christians. Instead, this order aligns the federal government with Christian Nationalism, a dangerous conflation of fundamentalist Christianity, conservative politics, and fierce patriotism that distorts what it means to be an American citizen and an engaged Christian in society.

With this executive order, the federal government has given itself the authority to define what might be considered "anti-Christian," and therefore also the authority to define what is Christian — a power which belongs to the Church alone, not the federal government. This executive order violates religious freedom, corrupts the separation of church and state, and creates a more hostile environment for Christians and all citizens who believe differently than the current administration and its religious advisors.

We feel so strongly that this task force is a threat to our values and our freedom that we wrote a public statement and invited religious leaders and others to sign on (https://www.wichurches.org/articles/religious-liberty). We now have over 250 signers, and we invite all who care about religious freedom and the preservation of our democracy to join us.

Christian Nationalism is a dangerous ideology that distorts the Gospel and turns Jesus and Christianity into a weapon for power and division instead of a movement towards love and justice. It demands that a particular brand of Christianity be privileged by the state and impose that singular belief system in order to be a "good American." In order to protect religious freedom, the federal government must not align with one religious ideology but rather honor the constitutional mandate to defend space for religious pluralism and ensure that each member of society is free to practice their religion, or no religion, while keeping the peace and working together for the common good. Please join us as we call upon the President of the United States and all elected officials to protect religious freedom in our country and uphold the constitution of the United States of America.








VBS News




